


Dementia Praecox

Abravanel's World of Torah: Shemot Volume I covers the first six parshiyot in Sefer Shemot. This volume features a systematic translation of Abravanel's classic commentary beginning with Parashat Shemot until the end of Parashat Mishpatim, plus much more.

Abravanel's World of Torah: Shemot Volume II concludes Sefer Shemot. It features an in depth analysis of the Mishkan (Tabernacle), the Thirteen Attributes, and much more.
